


HORNBY HIGH SCHOOL PROSPECTUS

Years 7 & 8 were added in 2014. In recent years Hornby has become a popular place to live, work, and do business, as our school continues to grow and have significant community support.

Between 2017 and 2019 the whole school campus will be redeveloped with brand new buildings and facilities to accommodate 800 students, eventually growing to over 1200. These exciting developments will provide the school with a 21st century learning environment and amazing facilities for our 21st century students. MANAIAKALANI - LEARN, CREATE, SHARE


Hornby High School is a Manaiakalani school. The Manaiakalani Programme (which translates as 'The Hook of Heaven') was developed in East Auckland over ten years ago and is designed to accelerate learning. The programme has been proven to be extremely effective for all learners regardless of their age or social circumstance. Hornby High School, as part of the Hornby cluster of schools Uru Mānuka, is proud to be part of the Manaiakalani Outreach Programme, one of over six clusters throughout New Zealand. Students coming to Hornby High School from other cluster schools will have a seamless transition which will maintain their learning.

In the Manaiakalani programme teaching and learning is based on the pedagogy of Learn, Create, Share. These are the basic building blocks of successful learning for all students. Modern learners need easy access to digital technology by which they can interact with the world and can publish their learning to

a global audience. The impact of the pedagogy is accelerated with the use of digital devices, in this case a Chromebook. The programme has been demonstrated to accelerate learning by up to twice national averages, regardless of background.

ONE-TO-ONE DIGITAL DEVICES

We require all students to have their own digital device, a chromebook in Years 7 - 10, and an appropriate device from Years 11-13. Whilst the school provides many computers, the success of the Manaiakalani programme depends on each student having their own device provided by the family. The school can often help families buy a chromebook for their child.





LEARNING PROGRAMMES



YEARS 7-10 THE LEARNING PATHWAY

In the Junior College we treat every student as an individual and in conjunction with parents, create a personalised pathway through secondary school that will lead to a bright, successful and fulfilling future for all. We pay careful attention to the needs of the whole child – academic, social, pastoral, cultural, and sporting.

All learning is approached through our shared pedagogy 'Learn Create Share', amplified with the use of digital technologies. Achievement data shows acceleration in achievement for students as they engage with their learning through this digital world. This is an approach that children will have used consistently in their years of learning in our partnership schools in the Uru Mānuka cluster, and this consistency helps support transition to their secondary school years.

Students in Years 7 to 10 enjoy a balanced curriculum concentrated around the eight learning areas of English, Mathematics, Science, Social Science, Technology, The Arts, and Physical Education and Health. Students also participate in project based learning as part of the year 7-9 curriculum. Literacy skills and computing are taught across the curriculum in all subjects and students have the opportunity to learn a second language. Hornby High School has a bilingual class, Whanau Reo Rua, for year 7 and 8 students.



COMMUNITY IMPACT DAY

Every Wednesday students in year 7 & 8 take part in Community Impact Day. During this time students will have the opportunity to participate in extracurricular activities based on their passions, be part of student led Community Projects, develop leaderships skills, and explore my passion is my career.

PASSIONS

Students are encouraged to participate in extracurricular activities based on their passions. These activities include dance, singing, leadership, a range of sports, kapa haka and more.

COMMUNITY IMPACT PROJECTS

Students take part in projects that have a positive impact on the community based on the following four themes:

- Giving back to the community of Hornby or Christchurch
- Bettering our school by __ (actual beautification or process)
- Spreading an idea or message people need to know more about
- Our world would be better if we had __ (invention)

Students can apply or are nominated to be part of several groups that grow and develop leadership such as;

YEARS 11-13 THE CAREER PATHWAY

Achievement in the senior years is built upon the strong foundation laid in the Junior College. The school's underlying pedagogy 'Learn Create Share', amplified as it is with the use of digital technologies (Chromebooks in particular), means that students have good foundation skills in literacy and numeracy, and digital technologies, with which to support their learning across all other areas.

The Senior College caters for students of all abilities and offers a quality, relevant, programme with flexibility and a wide choice of subjects. In the senior



years we work closely with each student and their families to ensure there is a strong connection between the subjects chosen, qualifications gained, and their planned career pathway.

The Career Education Programme is a strong feature of the school. Every student has regular academic interviews to ensure their learning programme is on track to help them achieve their career goals. To allow students to explore careers they have the opportunity to take part in work experience, STAR Taster Courses, or the Gateway programme, in Years 12 and 13. A strong mentoring programme offers students plenty of opportunities to connect with those from outside the world of school. Students can work with mentors from University, Polytech, and the business world, to help improve their understanding of tertiary education and guide decision making.

SPORTS, ARTS, MUSIC & CULTURE

Hornby High School has a proud sports record at local, regional and national level. We encourage students to participate in a wide range of activities outside the classroom. These activities develop physical, mental, and social skills. They build students' self-esteem and confidence and this is often reflected in greater effort and achievement in the classroom.

The school has a Sport Coordinator who organises events and teams. All students are encouraged to participate in a sporting, recreational, or cultural, activity during school time or afterschool. Students at all levels have the opportunity to participate in sport and physical activity. We also offer opportunities for students to develop leadership, coaching, and refereeing skills. The emphasis is on fair play, enthusiasm and enjoyment as well as achievement. On Friday afternoon Year 7 and 8 students take part in the Award Winning Friday Cluster Sport Module. Over 700 students from local primary schools are in teams coached by Hornby High School's Year 11-13 physical education students.

The addition of a new gymnasium gives us the scope to offer more sports opportunities to our students and the wider community.

Hornby High School offers a wide range of cultural and creative activities to students at all levels and all students are encouraged to participate. We have regular Arts Evenings, International Concerts, Theatre Sports, Shakespeare Festival, Kapa Haka, Polyfest, Junior Arts Festival and an Art Exhibition.

The school is particularly well resourced to provide cultural opportunities for our students. Music, Drama, and Art, are taught and experienced in our specialist work spaces. The Auditorium provides an excellent facility to showcase all the performing arts. Student Art work is regularly published online and in the local paper. Students share their progress and developing skills as artists and performers with their own online blog.

We have many successful co-curricular groups including Theatre sports, Shakespeare festival group, Polyfest groups, and vocal groups. Our vocal group Voices with Soul were named best choir at the "Voices festival' in 2018. Performance is a strength at Hornby, we hold termly performance events and run a Musical Theatre showcase mid-year.

Hornby High School has a long tradition of welcoming and supporting students from all over the world. Hornby High School offers a multicultural, inclusive, caring, environment in which international students are made very welcome.
